***Late Saxon and Norman Churches  
in the Humber Basin: architecture and  
building stone.***

"From the Lincoln Edge to the dip slope of the Magnesian Limestone, across the Humberhead Levels, the churches show a mix of building stone which appears not entirely logical, from the use of Pennine Millstone Grit in north Lincolnshire to the use of Lincolnshire/East Yorkshire Middle Jurassic oolitic limestones at Thorne. After providing an architectural framework with a brief review of the styles of medieval building, from Late Saxon to Perpendicular, the course will consist of a field visit to several of the churches in the area, where the reasons for this use and re-use of materials will be considered."

Meeting at Blaxton Village Hall at 10am, returning after minibus tour at approximately 4pm. Cost £20, advance booking required. Please wear suitable outdoor clothing and bring a packed lunch.
